

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 WEDNESDAY, JUNE 9, 1999 - 0530 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Mobilization of resources through the National Interagency Coordination Center was minimal. Demobilization of resources is occurring in the Southern and Southwest Areas. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Louisiana, Georgia, New Mexico, Arizona and West Texas.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

LA JARA, Cibola NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Bustamonte) is assigned. The fire is burning in timber 10 miles north of Grants, NM. Mop-up and rehabilitation of control lines continue. Demobilization of excess personnel also continues. A Type III fire organization is established and will transition with the Type II team today.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

FRIENDLY, Osceola NF. A Type I Incident Management Team (Melton) is assigned. Mop-up continues on hot spots observed by the infrared flights. Rehabilitation and demobilization are continuing. Transition to a Type III team is planned for Wednesday.

RICE CABIN, Chattahoochee-Oconee NF. This lightning caused fire is burning in steep terrain in storm blow down and bug killed timber. Heavy duff is also causing some control problems. Structures in Unicoi State Park were threatened, but none were lost.

OUTLOOK:

New Mexico will be partly cloudy with slight chance of afternoon showers and thunderstorms in the east central and southeast parts of the state. The west and north will be fair. High temperatures will be in the 70's and mid 80's in the mountains and north, with upper 80's to the mid 90's in the lower elevations.

Arizona will be sunny. Winds will be southerly at 10 to 20 MPH with gusts to 30 MPH. High temperatures will be in the 60's to 80's in the mountains and 85 to 103 in the valleys.

Northern Florida will be mostly cloudy with a slight chance of showers and thunderstorms. Winds will be easterly at 5 to 15 MPH. High temperatures will be 85 to 90.

Georgia will be partly sunny with a slight chance of afternoon thunderstorms. Winds will be variable at 5 to 10 MPH. High temperatures will be 85 to 95.
