

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT  
 WEDNESDAY, JUNE 23, 1999 - 0530 MDT  
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Moderate initial attack activity was reported in the Eastern Great Basin, California, Rocky Mountain, and Southern Areas. Large fire activity continued in Alaska and the Southwest. New large fires were reported in Northern California, Southern California and the Eastern Great Basin. The National Interagency Coordination Center mobilized radio equipment, a caterer, shower, type II helicopter, infrared aircraft and miscellaneous overhead. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Nevada, Arizona, Utah, and California.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

BOX CANYON, Saguaro National Monument. A Fire Use Management Team (Johnson) is assigned. This lightning ignited wildland fire is being managed to accomplish resource objectives. This fire is east of Tucson, AZ. Retardant was dropped to protect endangered frogs. The west and south flanks continue to be improved by crews. No substantial fire behavior was reported yesterday.

REAMER, Prescott National Forest. This fire is burning in grasslands near Camp Verde, AZ. No other information was reported.

MEXICO 15, Coronado National Forest. This fire is in a very remote location thirty miles northwest of Nogales, AZ. No new information was received.

KING, Los Padres National Forest. A Type II Management Team (Smith) is assigned. This fire is approximately 8 miles south of Frazier Park, north of Los Angeles. Current threats are to the watershed and to Forest Service recreational sites. Access to the fire is very limited.

RED, Tehama-Glenn Ranger Unit, California Dept. of Forestry. This fire is burning eight miles southwest of Red Bluff, CA. The fire is burning in grass and woodland and is being pushed by north to northeast winds. The area is mostly ranch land and current threats are to scattered structures and livestock.

OUTLOOK:

Arizona will be mostly sunny with a slight chance of afternoon showers and thunderstorms over the White Mountains. High temperatures will be from 75 to 93 degrees in the mountains, 90 to 105 in the valleys, and 105 to 115 in the deserts and near the Colorado River.

New Mexico will be partly cloudy with widely scattered afternoon and evening thunderstorms in the west, central mountains, and eastern portions of the state. High temperatures will be in the 70's and 80's in the mountains and in the high 80's to the 90's in the valleys, except in the extreme southwest desert, where temperatures will reach 100.

Utah will be mostly sunny. High temperatures will be from 65 to 80 in the mountains, 85 to 95 in the valleys, and 95 to 100 in the southwest part of

the state.

Southern Idaho will be mostly sunny. High temperatures will be in the high 70's in the mountains and 80's in the lower elevations.

Alaska's interior region will be partly to mostly cloudy with showers and isolated thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the low to mid 70s.
