Skyland, Flathead NF. IMT 2 (LaFave). Forty-five miles east of Whitefish, MT. Timber, litter and understory. Very active fire behavior with short crown runs, spotting and torching. U.S. Highway 2 closed at East Glacier, MT. Structures remain threatened. Campground and trail closures remain in effect.

Ahorn, Lewis and Clark NF. IMT 1 (Bennett). IMT is also managing Novak, Little Wolf Creek and Meriwether fires. Thirty miles west of Augusta, MT. Timber litter. Torching with short runs. Structures remain threatened. Evacuations remain in effect.

Poe Cabin, Craig Mountain Area Office, Idaho Department of Lands. IMT 1 (Stanich). Twenty-three miles southwest of Grangeville, ID. Timber and grass. Moderate fire behavior with short runs, torching and backing fire. Numerous structures threatened, and evacuations remain in effect.

Mile Marker 124, Southwestern Land Office, Montana DNR. IMT 2 (Angell). Nineteen miles southeast of Missoula, MT. Timber, and grass. Intense ground fire with short crown runs. Traffic restrictions on I- 90 in effect. Structures, powerlines and petroleum pipeline remain threatened.

Sawmill Creek, Lolo NF. IMT 2 (Heintz). Twenty-two miles southeast of Missoula, MT. Timber. Short crown runs with long-range spotting. Numerous structures remain threatened.

Meriwether, Helena NF. Thirty-seven miles northwest of Helena, MT. Timber and grass. Active plume-dominated fire behavior with running. Structures remain threatened. Evacuations remain in effect.

Rattlesnake, Nez Perce NF. IMT 2 (Turman). IMT is also managing the Concord fire. Twenty-five miles south of Elk City, ID. Timber, timber litter and grass. Moderate fire behavior with short crown runs, torching and creeping. Communities and recreation areas remain threatened.

Garceau, Flathead Agency, BIA. IMT 2 (Grant). Fifty-five miles south of Whitefish, MT. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior, torching and creeping. Power lines and structures remain threatened.

Chimney Complex, Craig Mountain Area Office, Idaho Department of Lands. IMT 2 (Kusicko). Nineteen miles south of Lewiston, ID. Timber and grass. Torching. Numerous structures remain threatened.

Owl, Yellowstone NP. IMT 2 (Wilder). Forty-five miles south of Bozeman, MT. Timber, grass, snags. Smoldering. Structures remain threatened.

Bridge, Clearwater NF. Forty-five miles southwest of Missoula, MT. Timber and understory. Active fire behavior with intensive burning. Structures remain threatened. Area closures remain in effect.

Pattengail Creek, Beaverhead/Deerlodge NF. Ten miles northeast of Wisdom, MT. Bug-kill timber. Isolated torching.

Fool Creek, Lewis and Clark NF. FUMT (Hall). Thirty miles northwest of Choteau, MT. Timber. Spatial crown runs, long-range spotting and surface fire.

Concord, Nez Perce NF. Twenty miles southwest of Elk City, ID. Y . Timber litter. Active fire behavior with torching and short-range spotting. Structures remain threatened.

Conger Creek, Lolo NF. Twenty miles north of Ovando, MT. Previously reported. Timber. Active plume-dominated fire behavior with running and spotting. Structures threatened.

Wyman #2, Lolo NF. Twenty-three miles east of Hamilton, MT. Timber. Running crown fire with long-range spotting. Structures threatened. Evacuation of campgrounds and trails in effect.

Brush Creek, Flathead NF. Twenty-five miles west of Whitefish, MT. Timber and understory. Active fire behavior with crowning and long-range spotting. Road and recreation site closures.

Fisher Point, Lolo NF. Twenty miles east of Stevensville, MT. Timber. Extreme fire behavior with crowning, running and torching.

Hidden, Clearwater NF. Eleven miles southeast of Powell, ID. Timber. Intense fire activity. Several structures threatened. Last narrative report unless significant activity occurs.

Harrington Ridge, Bitterroot NF. Twenty-six miles southwest of Hamilton, MT. Previously reported. Timber. Running, crowning, torching and spotting. Structures threatened. Last narrative report unless significant activity occurs.

Area Command Team (Ribar) is assigned to manage large fires for the Boise and Payette National Forests.

Cascade Complex (four fires), Boise NF. IMT 1 (Opliger). Three miles northeast of Cascade, ID. Timber and timber litter. Extreme plume-dominated crown fire and spotting. Communities and structures remain threatened.

East Zone Complex (three fires), Payette NF. IMT 1 (Pincha-Tulley). Thirty miles northeast of McCall, ID. Timber litter, brush and grass. Active fire behavior with running and backing. Communities, historic sites, bridges, campgrounds and numerous structures remain threatened.

Middle Fork Complex (five fires), Boise NF. IMT 2 (Harvey). Fifteen miles northeast of Garden Valley, ID. Timber and brush. Extreme fire behavior with sustained crown runs and short-range spotting. Structures remain threatened.

Murphy Complex (two fires), Twin Falls District, BLM. Two IMT 1 (Hawkins and Molumby). Fifty-six miles southwest of Twin Falls, ID. Brush and juniper. Creeping.

Trapper Ridge, Boise NF. FUMT (Hahnenberg). Twenty-eight miles northeast of Idaho City, ID. Timber and hardwood litter. Active fire behavior with torching and short-range spotting. Structures remain threatened.

Raines, Payette NF. Thirty-eight miles northeast of McCall, ID. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with running and torching. Structures remain threatened.

Granite Creek, Bridger-Teton NF. Fifteen miles southeast of Jackson, WY. Timber, dead and down timber. Light to moderate fire behavior with isolated torching. Campgrounds and trails closed.

Krassel Complex (six fires), Payette NF. FUMT (Ourada/Soper). FUMT is also managing the Raines fire. Forty-four miles northeast of Yellow Pine, ID. Grass, brush, timber litter and downed logs. Active fire behavior with torching.

Van Horn, Salmon-Challis NF. Fifteen miles north of Challis, ID. Timber litter, snags, dead and down timber. Torching and creeping.

Black Pine 2, Sawtooth NF. Started on private land eleven miles southeast of Malta, ID. Timber, grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior.

Monument Complex, Umatilla NF. Transfer of command from IMT 2 (West) back to the local unit tomorrow. Five miles north of Monument, OR. Timber, juniper, mixed conifer and grass. Creeping and smoldering.

WSA Lightning Complex (three fires), Warm Springs Agency, BIA. Washington IMT 2 (Jennings). Twenty-one miles southwest of Warm Springs, OR. Timber litter, bug-killed trees and brush. Active fire behavior with torching.

Tolo, North Cascades NP. FUMT (Bonefeld). Thirty three miles west of Winthrop, WA. Timber litter. Interior torching, spotting and smoldering. Historic structures threatened.

Les Blair, Washington DNR. Eleven miles southeast of Kennewick, WA. Tall grass. Wind-driven fire behavior.
