HIGHS MID 50'S TO NEAR 70 GEORGIA AND 60'S AND 70'S FLORIDA. DECREASING SHOWERS AND CLOUDS MONDAY. THE OUTLOOK FOR TUESDAY THE 12TH THROUGH SATURDAY THE 16TH WILL BE ABOVE NORMAL TEMPERATURES AND BELOW NORMAL PRECIPITATION FOR GEORGIA AND THE FLORIDA PANHANDLE, WITH NEAR NORMAL PRECIPITATION FOR THE REMAINDER OF FLORIDA.

HIGHS WILL RANGE FROM THE 50'S IN SOUTHERN GEORGIA TO THE 60'S IN CENTRAL FLORIDA AND THE MID 70'S IN SOUTHERN FLORIDA. THE OUTLOOK FOR WEDNESDAY JANUARY 20TH THROUGH SATURDAY THE 23RD CALLS FOR ABOVE NORMAL TEMPERATURES AND NEAR NORMAL PRECIPITATION.

HIGHS WILL RANGE IN THE 50'S TO LOWER 60'S IN SOUTHERN GEORGIA AND NORTHERN FLORIDA, 60'S IN CENTRAL FLORIDA AND MID 70'S IN SOUTHERN FLORIDA. WEATHER - SOUTHEASTERN UNITED STATES

A COLD FRONTAL SYSTEM OVER THE OHIO RIVER VALLEY DROPS TO CENTRAL FLORIDA BY SATURDAY MORNING, PRODUCING CLOUDY SKIES AND RAIN TAPERING OFF ON SATURDAY. BEHIND THE FRONT, DRIER AND COLDER NORTHWESTERLY FLOW WILL SPREAD ACROSS THE REGION. FAIR TO PARTLY CLOUDY CONDITIONS EXPECTED ON SUNDAY AND MONDAY. HIGHS DROPPING INTO THE 40' S AND 50'S EXCEPT 60'S IN SOUTHERN FLORIDA. A LOW PRESSURE SYSTEM TRACKS ACROSS THE REGION ON TUESDAY WITH INCREASING CLOUDS AND CHANCE OF SHOWERS. THE OUTLOOK FOR TUESDAY FEB 2nd THROUGH SATURDAY FEB 6th CALLS FOR NEAR NORMAL TEMPERATURES AND NEAR TO ABOVE NORMAL PRECIPITATION.
