

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 SUNDAY SEPTEMBER 25, 1994 - 0900 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL III

Current Situation: Fire activity increased in the Northwest, Northern Rockies and on existing fires in Idaho. The Northwest and Northern Rockies each committed two Type II Incident Management Teams internally. Resource mobilization through NICC increased.

North Zone - California Large Fires:

BARKLEY, Lassen NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Madden) is assigned. Firing operations along Mill Creek are in progress and proceeding well. Demobilization of resources has begun and is expected to increase today. Incident base received light thundershowers yesterday afternoon.

SPECIMEN, Klamath NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Phenix) is assigned. Structures at Sawyers Bar and other locations continue to be a major concern as the fire continues to spread in a southerly direction. Torching and are still occurring.

Eastern Great Basin Area Large Fires:

THUNDERBOLT, Boise NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (McAtee) is assigned. Fire activity increased with higher temperatures and lower humidities. The fire burned actively through the night. Air operations were hampered by an inversion yesterday.

CORRAL CREEK/BLACKWELL COMPLEX, Payette NF. A Type I Incident Management Team (Wands) is assigned. The north end of the Corral fire has burned into a BLM felled and bucked timber sale area in the Carey Creek drainage. Burnout operations on the Blackwell are going as planned. New areas of active ground fire occurred throughout the complex. Very low humidities continue with very little recovery at night.

CHICKEN COMPLEX, Payette NF. An inversion kept activity low until it lifted, then significant fire behavior occurred.

FOX POINT, Wallowa-Whitman NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Lukens) is assigned. The fire started yesterday afternoon on the north edge of the Eagle Cap wilderness.

REED, Malheur NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Groshong) is assigned. SPRIGNETTE BUTTE, Oregon State. A State Team (Mair) is assigned. An inversion over the fire kept the fire from making significant growth. Burnout operations were planned for last night. Twenty homes are possibly threatened and structure protection is in place.
