WEDNESDAY 06/01/94 0530 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL I

Current Situation: Initial attack activity continued in Alaska, California, and the Southwest Areas. Initial attack activity was reported in Eastern and Western Great Basin and Rocky Mountain Areas. The Southwest Area ordered a Type 2 helicopter for the Spirit fire at Lake Mead National Recreation Area.

The Southern Area continued to have initial attack activity in North Carolina and Florida. Lake Woodruff NWR in Florida has a 100 acre fire. The MAFFS units in North Carolina were released yesterday.

FISH DAY FIRE - The Southern Area's Type I Incident Management Team (Mann) is committed. The fire received a significant amount of rain yesterday. Demobilization of some aircraft and overhead is planned for today. Helicopters flew a total of 27.5 hours yesterday.

Outlook: The southeast seaboard from North Carolina south to Florida will be partly cloudy with scattered afternoon and evening thundershowers. Fire activity should moderate with the exception of Florida, which continues to have potential for fire activity. Southern California and Arizona will be mostly sunny and hot. New Mexico will be partly cloudy with widely scattered afternoon and evening thunderstorms. The potential for fire activity to increase exists in southern California, Arizona and southern Nevada.

THURSDAY 06/02/94 0530 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL I

Current Situation: Initial attack activity was reported in the Eastern Great Basin, Southern and Southwest Areas, with one large fire reported in Arizona. Airtankers flew extensively on initial attack missions mainly in Arizona. Large fire suppression continued in the Western Great Basin.

Southwest Area - Mackenzie Fire. The fire is 2,000 acres and is burning in chaparral. A Southwest Area Type II team has been assigned. The fire was very active yesterday requiring internal mobilization of crews and aircraft.

Southern Area - Fish Day Fire. The fire is 100% contained at 24,600 acres. Demobilization is in progress. There is concern as the fire still has hot spots burning in peat. Mop up efforts will be focused on these areas to reduce the chance of the fire surfacing.

Outlook: A cold front will become stationary across South Carolina and Georgia bringing partly cloudy weather with scattered afternoon and evening thundershowers. Fire activity should decrease with the exception of Florida. Partly cloudy over southeast Arizona and New Mexico with scattered afternoon and evening thunderstorms. Mostly sunny, hot and dry over the remainder of Arizona and Nevada. High pressure, building in southern California, will result in sunny, warmer and drier weather, and morning low clouds along the coast. Anticipate fire activity to increase in southern California and the Southwest Area.

 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL I

Current Situation: Minor initial attack activity occurred in the Eastern Great Basin, southern California, and Southern Areas. Large fire suppression continued in the Western Great Basin and Southwest Areas, along with initial attack on state lands in southern Arizona. Mobilization to the Mackenzie fire in Arizona included 3 Type 2 helicopters, 1 catering and 1 shower unit, and miscellaneous communications equipment. The two remaining airtankers on the Fish Day fire in North Carolina will be released today.

Outlook: RED FLAG WATCH for northwest Arizona and southwest Utah for gusty winds, high temperatures and low humidities. Winds gusting to 25 mph and humidities dropping to 5% are forecast for Arizona. New Mexico will be partly cloudy with scattered afternoon and evening thundershowers. Winds and low humidities may hamper suppression efforts. A stationary front remains over South Carolina and Georgia, they can expect scattered afternoon and evening thundershowers.

NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL I

Current Situation: Initial attack activity occurred in Northern California and the Western Great Basin involving mobilization of airtankers from other geographic areas. The Eastern Great Basin and Southern California reported increasing fire activity with none escaping initial attack.

Doyle Fire - Located on the Plumas NF, is burning in bug killed timber causing safety concerns for ground forces. Observed fire behavior resembles August conditions. Resources mobilized included 4 airtankers, a Type 1 helicopter, 1 catering unit and 1 shower unit.

Miller Fire - Located on the Coronado NF is burning in oak, brush, manzanita and ponderosa pine. Denton's Type 1 team has been assigned. Other committed resources include a Type 1 helicopter, 1 catering unit, 5 Type 1 crews and communications equipment.

Outlook: A RED FLAG WATCH has been issued in northwest Arizona for gusty winds, high temperatures, and low humidities. Minimum humidities will be as low as 5 percent. Partly cloudy skies with scattered afternoon and evening thunderstorms are expected in New Mexico. Nevada will be sunny, hot and dry with locally breezy winds to 20 mph. Conditions in the Southwest and Western Great Basin will be conducive to an increase in fire activity. Initial attack activity is expected to continue in southern California with very low humidities and locally gusty winds present in the eastern deserts.

Miller Fire - Type I team (Denton) committed. The objective is to protect private land and residences. Some homes were evacuated yesterday, quick action prevented any structure loss.

Mule Fire - A prescribed natural fire declared a wildfire due to exceeding prescription parameters.

Current Situation: The Southwest Area continued to experience large fires with good progress being made towards containment on most of them. Minimal activity was reported from the other areas, except southern California which reported one fire that was contained.

The Miller fire with Type I Incident Management Team (Denton) committed, is located approximately 12 miles south of Sierra Vista, AZ. A new start briefly threatened homes but was successfully stopped before causing any damage.

The Hassayampa fire has a handline around it and is reported to be looking good with containment expected this morning. There is no longer a threat to the communities of Groom Creek and Walker.

The Mule fire reported good progress in line construction and burn-out operations. Unburned islands in the interior of the fire are putting up considerable amounts of smoke.

Outlook: Florida will be partly cloudy with scattered afternoon and evening thundershowers. Arizona and New Mexico will be mostly sunny with winds 15-25 MPH, and relative humidities of 5-20%. Southern California will be mostly sunny with west to north winds 15-30 MPH over the mountain ridges and eastern deserts. Expect continued fire activity in the south western states.

NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL I

Current Situation: Initial attack and large fire activity continued in the Southwest Area. Minimal initial attack activity occurred elsewhere. Five Type I Crews from the Northern Rockies, and four Airtankers from the Northwest were mobilized to Southwest on June 6. Four Type I Crews from the Northwest and one Airtanker and one Lead Plane from South Zone were mobilized to the Southwest. A Type I Incident Management Team was committed internally in the Southwest. Two caterers, a shower and numerous overhead were also mobilized to the Southwest.

The Bridge fire on the Lincoln NF is located 6 miles northwest of Timberon. A Type I Incident Management Team (Shaw) has been assigned to manage the fire. A 4-H camp has voluntarily been evacuated. Structures are nearby but not threatened at this time. A timber sale and slash are of concern.

The Rito fire on the Sante Fe NF was a prescribed natural fire that was declared a wildfire this afternoon. A Type II Incident Management Team (Lente) has been assigned to manage the fire. The fire is located in the Pecos Wilderness and made some major runs yesterday.

The Miller fire which has Type I Incident Management Team (Denton) committed, has major demobilization planned for today.

The Cibola NF in New Mexico has three new fires being managed in containment strategy for a total of 3,775 acres.

Outlook: Florida will be partly cloudy with scattered thunderstorms in the north and numerous showers and thundershowers in the south. The Southwest will be sunny and warm with winds from 10-20 MPH. Arizona will have humidities from 5-15%. Southern California will be sunny and warm with winds from 10-20 MPH over the mountain ridges and eastern deserts. Large fire and initial attack activity is expected to continue in the Southwest Area. No significant fire activity is expected elsewhere.

Current Situation: Initial attack and large fires continued in the Southwest Area necessitating the mobilization of 10 Type I Crews, 1 caterer, 1 shower, 2 Type II Helicopters, 1 Type I helicopter and an Infrared aircraft through NICC. Denton's Type I Incident Management Team was reassigned from the Miller fire to the Ryan fire.

Alaska and the Eastern Great Basin reported an increase in fire activity yesterday. No significant fire activity was reported from any other Geographic Areas. Alaska has 8 limited fires for 154 acres.

Southwest Area Fires:

Bridge - Type I Incident Management Team (Shaw) committed. Very erratic fire behavior and strong wind gusts resulted in the precautionary evacuation of fire camp and the community of Timberon (approximately 300 residents). Similar fire behavior is expected today.

Ryan - Type I Incident Management Team (Denton) committed. This incident is comprised of three fires previously being suppressed under containment strategy. No other information was received.

Rito - Type II Incident Management Team (Lente) committed. Cooler temperatures at night have assisted firefighters. Engines have been placed near private property as a precautionary measure; however, no structures are in immediate danger.

Marcus - Type II Incident Management Team (Bedlion) committed. Fire is burning in light fuels and spreading rapidly towards pinon-juniper and coniferous forest.

Outlook: Initial attack and large fire suppression will continue in the Southwest Area as hot, dry, and breezy weather persists. Isolated afternoon thunderstorms are expected in New Mexico and will increase the probability of new starts there.

Southern California has the potential for an increase of initial attack with sunny and warmer weather.

Current Situation: Initial attack and large fires continued in the Southwest Area. Internal movement of 10 crews occurred utilizing the NICC jet. Miscellaneous overhead continued to be mobilized through NICC.

Alaska continues to report increasing initial attack activity. Alaska has 16 limited fires for 286 acres.

Southwest Area Fires:

Bridge, Lincoln NF. Type I Incident Management Team (Shaw) committed. Fair progress was made yesterday on line construction. Lighter than predicted winds aided burnout operations. A run on the northeast flank added about 250 acres.

Ryan Complex, Cibola NF. Type I Incident Management Team (Denton) committed. The complex includes the Ryan, Coffee Pot and Bull fires. The Coffee Pot fire reported intense fire behavior causing all line to be lost. Burnout operations on the Ryan fire took place to prevent the fire from entering a major drainage.

Rito, Santa Fe NF. Type II Incident Management Team (Lente) committed. The fire is contained and rehabilitation and demobilization is in progress.

Mule, Gila NF. Line is now completed and mop-up and control efforts are progressing well.

Marcus, Guadalupe NP. Type II Incident Management Team (Bedlion) committed. Six structures and associated facilities were saved by airtanker, handcrew and engine support. The fire has spread from light fuels into pinon-juniper and conifer forest.

Rest, Phoenix District, BLM. The fire is burning along Highway 17 between Cordes Junction and Black Canyon.

Outlook: Arizona will continue to be dry and a little warmer. The western half of New Mexico will be sunny and warm, while the eastern half will have a little higher relative humidities due to isolated thunderstorms. The potential still exists for initial attack and large fire activity in the Southwest Area. Southern California will continue to be sunny and hot.

Current Situation: Good progress was made on large fires in the Southwest Area. Re-assignment of resources is occurring as some fires reach containment. Initial attack was limited with the majority occurring in New Mexico. Minor initial attack was reported in Alaska and southern California.

Southwest Area Fires:
 MONARCH, Phoenix District, BLM. One railroad bridge was destroyed. Fifteen homes and another railroad bridge are threatened. The fire has jumped both the Hassayampa River and four lane State Highway 93.

BRIDGE, Lincoln NF. Type I Incident Management Team (Shaw) committed. Good progress made on handline and dozer line construction yesterday. Cloud cover over the fire has raised humidities resulting in fewer flare-ups and less spotting, though heavily concentrated fuels remain extremely volatile. Spotting and reburn potential remains severe. The threat to Timberon, NM and surrounding ranches is reduced; residents are returning at their own risk. An infrared flight was completed last night.

MARCUS, Guadalupe NP. Type II Incident Management Team (Bedlion) committed. The fire continues burning in steep inaccessible terrain and is experiencing erratic winds. Current threats are to historical structures, a ranger station, threatened and endangered species, and riparian areas.

RYAN COMPLEX, Cibola NF. Type I Incident Management Team (Denton) committed. The Coffee Pot and Bull fires have burned together. Due to heavy fuels and intense fire behavior an indirect fire suppression strategy is being used. Four miles of burnout will occur on the south flank today. Good progress was made on the Ryan fire minimizing acreage increase.

SYCAMORE, Phoenix District, BLM. The fire is burning in light to heavy fuels. There is a completed retardant line around the perimeter. A caterer has been mobilized.

Outlook: Arizona will be mostly sunny with a few isolated thunderstorms in the southeast corner. The weather will continue to be hot and dry with humidities staying between 5-15%. Temperatures will reach 90 to 115 degrees in the valleys and 70 to mid-80's in the upper elevations. Eastern New Mexico will have afternoon thunderstorms and slightly higher relative humidities, while the western part of the state will remain hot and dry. These conditions will continue to hamper suppression efforts in Arizona and western New Mexico, while higher humidities in eastern New Mexico will assist firefighters.

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT

MONDAY 06/13/94 0530 MDT

NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

Current Situation: New starts from lightning in western Colorado resulted in the mobilization of 8 smokejumpers from the Western Great Basin. Initial attack activity occurred in southern California and several airtankers were mobilized from other geographic areas.

Lightning activity in the Southwest Area increased initial attack activity, however, most were contained at minimal acreages. Internal mobilization of a Type II Incident Management Team, miscellaneous overhead and crews occurred yesterday for the Flat Complex. A caterer was mobilized through NICC for the Flat Complex.

FLAT COMPLEX, New Mexico State - Type II Incident Management Team (Blackwell) committed. Multiple lightning ignitions are combined in this complex in the southwest corner of New Mexico. High winds and rough terrain are hampering suppression efforts. No improvements are threatened at this time.

BRIDGE, Lincoln NF. Type I Incident Management Team (Shaw) committed. Dry thunderstorms caused flare-ups along control lines and within the interior, all lines held however, with no increase in acreage. Work continues to strengthen lines and hold spot fires within the interior. Heavy mop-up operation is advancing, heavy fuel loads are slowing down progress. Overall situation looks promising for containment within 36 hours.

MARCUS, Guadalupe NP. Type II Incident Management Team (Bedlion) committed. The fire is contained and mop-up and rehabilitation activities are continuing.

RYAN COMPLEX, Cibola NF. Type I Incident Management Team (Denton) committed. The Ryan fire is 100% contained. Crews are continuing burn out operations, patrol and mop-up on the Coffee Pot fire. Major demobilization is planned for today, pending any unforeseen circumstances.

MONARCH, Phoenix District, BLM. Good progress was made yesterday. Mop-up operations are continuing.

SYCAMORE. Phoenix District, BLM. Mop-up procedures continuing.

Outlook: Arizona will be sunny, hot and breezy with wind gusts up to 30 MPH. New Mexico will be partly cloudy east and south with widely scattered afternoon thunderstorms. Northwest New Mexico will be breezy. The potential for initial attack and large fire activity persists in the Southwest Area. Southern California will be sunny and dry above the coastal fog. The southern desert will have winds up to 30 MPH late in the afternoon. Increased fire activity is probable.

NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

Current Situation: Increased initial attack activity occurred in Alaska, 56 smokejumpers have been committed. The Rocky Mountain Area also exhibited increased fire activity, 1 airtanker was mobilized through NICC to aid suppression tactics. Good progress has been made on most fires in the Southwest Area, while initial attack activity continues.

DIVIDE CREEK, Colorado State. Type II Incident Management Team (Hart) committed. The fire has destroyed one residence and is threatening more rural residences, ranches and adjacent federal land. High winds and extremely dry fuels are causing control problems.

FLAT COMPLEX, New Mexico State - Type II Incident Management Team (Blackwell) The complex consists of five fires: Flat, Cowboy, Big Hatchet, Lynch and Center. The fire is threatening wildlife habitat, structures on Animas Peak, high value forage in the lower elevations and riparian areas. Hot and dry weather is hampering suppression efforts. A major burn-out is planned on the Center fire, all other fires are in good shape.

RYAN COMPLEX, Cibola NF. Type I Incident Management Team (Denton) committed. Crews are continuing to burn-out, patrol and mop-up the Coffee Pot fire. A storm cell over the fire yesterday afternoon with winds 50+ MPH caused a 150 acre slopover. All demobilization planned for today is on hold.

BRIDGE, Lincoln NF. Type I Incident Management Team (Shaw) committed. Good mop-up progress is being made. Heavy fuels and duff continue to cause spotting problems during the burn-out of unburned islands. The fire is 100% lined, however, full containment is pending on further strengthening of the fire line. Some demobilization of resources is occurring.

MARCUS, Guadalupe NP. Type II Incident Management Team (Bedlion) committed. Containment objectives have been met. All remaining resources will be demobilized today.

MONARCH, Phoenix District, BLM. The fire has been declared controlled.

Outlook: A RED FLAG WATCH has been posted for Arizona for low relative humidities and strong gusty winds. A RED FLAG WARNING has been posted for Nevada for low humidities and strong gusty winds. The potential for initial attack and large fire activity exists in the Southwest Area, Southern California, southern Utah and Nevada as mostly sunny, dry and windy conditions are forecast. New Mexico will have isolated thunderstorms in the southcentral mountains and southeast portion.

NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL III

Current Situation: Initial attack and large fire activity increased in Colorado and Utah. A Type I Crew and a Caterer were mobilized through NICC to Colorado. Two Type I Crews, a Caterer, Showers and Communications equipment were mobilized through NICC to Utah. Increased initial attack in Alaska necessitated the mobilization of miscellaneous overhead through NICC. High winds on fires in the Southwest caused control problems and delays in containment targets.

DIVIDE CREEK, Colorado State. Type II Incident Management Team (Hart) committed. The fire is burning in sagebrush and grass and is threatening structures. Erratic winds coupled with hot and dry conditions are hampering control efforts.

CARIN, Rocky Mountain NP, NPS. High winds caused the fire to escape the confine/contain lines. Additional resources are on order. A Type II Incident Management Team is being considered.

BRIDGE, Lincoln NF. Type I Incident Management Team (Shaw) committed. Winds up to 20 MPH fanned the fire yesterday, delaying containment. Helicopter water drops were used extensively to keep the fire from crossing the fire line and on unburned islands of fuel in the interior.

RYAN COMPLEX, Cibola NF. Type I Incident Management Team (Denton) committed. Thunderstorm activity over the fires caused suppression difficulties, causing the fire to escape fire line on both the Ryan and Coffee Pot fires. Erratic winds and heavy mixed conifer fuels are making line construction difficult. Five crewmembers were forced to deploy fire shelters on the Coffee Pot fire. All five firefighters escaped with no injuries. Additional resources are being ordered.

FLAT COMPLEX, New Mexico State - Type II Incident Management Team (Blackwell) committed. Good progress was made on all of the fires yesterday. Reduced acreage is due to remapping and less area involved in the burn-out on the Center Fire. Demobilization is to begin today.

WILLOW BASIN, Utah State and Manti-Lasal NF - Type I Incident Management Team (Birch) committed. The fire made a major run yesterday going from 50 acres to 2,000 acres in 3 hour period. Anticipated threats are to several mountain cabins and a Forest Service Guard Station in the direct path of the primary fire spread.

LAKELAND, California State. The fire is located in the Squirrel Mt. Valley near Lake Isabella. One residence has been destroyed, and several damaged. The fire is threatening approximately 200 structures. High winds are predicted to continue.

Outlook: A RED FLAG WATCH has been posted for Arizona, southern Utah, and southern Nevada for strong winds and very low relative humidities. Initial attack and large fire activity is expected to increase in the Great Basin. Hot, windy and dry in Arizona. Hot, dry and breezy in New Mexico with isolated afternoon and evening thunderstorms. Sunny, windy, and very warm in Colorado with southwest winds gusting to 40 MPH. Hot, dry and windy in the southern half of Utah and Nevada. Sunny and warm in southern California with very low humidities in the interior deserts. Fire activity is expected to increase in all the Areas above due to weather conditions.

NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL III

Current Situation: Large fire activity increased in Alaska, the Rocky Mountain and the Southwest Areas. One Type I crew was mobilized from the West Great Basin to the Rocky Mountain Area. Four Type III and Three Type II Helicopters, a Caterer, Shower and a ATMU were ordered for the Southwest Area. The Southwest will be prepositioning smokejumpers, with aircraft, from the Northern Rockies and the Northwest at a satellite base. South Zone has had frequent use of their airtankers on initial attack fires.

Rocky Mountain Area Large Fires:

CAIRNS, Rocky Mountain NP, NPS. This fire is being suppressed under confine/contain strategy. Natural barriers are being used and handline construction is being kept to a minimum. This will be the last report unless significant activity occurs.

DIVIDE CREEK, Colorado State. Type II Incident Management Team (Hart) has been demobilized and reassigned to the Rock Creek fire.

GUERNSEY, Wyoming State. The fire is located in Guernsey State Park. No other information available.

ROCK CREEK, Routt NF. Type II Incident Management Team (Hart) committed. No other information available.

Southwest Area Large Fires:

PIGEON, Gila NF. Type I Incident Management Team (Shaw) has been reassigned from the Bridge fire. The fire is located in the Aldo Leopold Wilderness and is threatening spotted owl and gila trout habitat. The fire is burning in heavy spruce, fir, aspen, ponderosa pine and brush. Heavy use of airtankers failed to stop the fire as it doubled in size hourly yesterday.

BRIDGE, Lincoln NF. Type II Incident Management Team (Bedlion) has been reassigned from the Marcus fire. Erratic winds (30+ MPH) continued, exposing hot spots within the unburned islands. Mop-up and patrol is continuing to strengthen the control lines.

SPRUCE, Gila NF - A Type II short Incident Management Team has been ordered. No other information available.

RYAN COMPLEX, Cibola NF. Type I Incident Management Team (Denton) committed. The Ryan fire is 80% contained, line was completed around the escaped portion. The Coffee Pot fire is 70% contained. Crews are constructing a contingency line around the fire in preparation for a new strategy. Logistic support is extremely slow due to a lack of roads and trails.

FLAT COMPLEX, New Mexico State - Type II Incident Management Team (Blackwell) The fire has been contained and demobilization is expected to begin today.

East Great Basin Large Fires:

WILLOW BASIN, Utah State and Manti-Lasal NF - Type I Incident Management Team (Birch) committed. Ten structures were saved, however, the fire continues to threaten more structures. Erratic fire behavior in pinon-juniper, oak brush and ponderosa pine occurred due to high winds, low relative humidity and high temperatures.

California Large Fires:

LAKELAND, California State. The fire is located in the Squirrel Mt. Valley near Lake Isabella. Two residences have been destroyed, and five damaged. Several sheds and outbuildings have been destroyed. The fire is threatening approximately 200 structures. The north flank of the fire is contained by the lake while the south flank presents difficulty for containment.

Alaska Large Fires:

413212, Alaska State. Type II Incident Management Team (Dash) committed. The fire is burning approximately 4 miles from the Alcan Hiway and burning parallel to it.

413275, Alaska State. Type II Incident Management Team (Wilcock) committed. Four type II crews were evacuated from the line on 6/14. Burning conditions in the area are hot and dry. There are no natural barriers to contain the fire.

Outlook: A RED FLAG WATCH has been posted for southern Nevada and northwest Arizona for strong winds and very low relative humidities. A RED FLAG WARNING has been posted for southern Utah for strong winds and very low relative humidities. Sunny and not quite so windy in New Mexico with afternoon and evening thunderstorms. Colorado, Utah, Nevada and southern California will be sunny, dry and windy. Northern Utah will be partly cloudy with isolated mountain showers. Northern Nevada will be partly cloudy and breezy. The potential exists for increased fire activity and competition for Airtankers, Type I Crews and Type II Helicopters.

NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL III

Current Situation: Large fire activity continued in Alaska, Rocky Mountain, Eastern Great Basin and the Southwest Areas. One Shower, five Airtankers, a booster crew of smokejumpers and numerous overhead were mobilized to the Southwest Area. A Caterer and numerous overhead were mobilized to the Rocky Mountain Area. Several overhead were mobilized to Alaska. Numerous units in the Southwest, Rocky Mountain, Great Basin, and California are reporting high to extreme fire indices.

Rocky Mountain Area Large Fires:

GUERNSEY, Wyoming State. No new information available.

ROCK CREEK, Routt NF. Type II Incident Management Team (Hart) committed. The fire is located on the Yampa Ranger District and is suspected to be human caused. No estimate of containment or control has been projected.

Southwest Area Large Fires:

PIGEON, Gila NF. Type I Incident Management Team (Shaw) committed. Major effort yesterday was to establish spike camps to support line personnel. Line constructed on the northwest side overnight will be used as an anchor point for major suppression effort today. Present plan includes heavy use of medium helicopters for crew transport and to support spike camps.

SPRUCE, Gila NF - Type II Incident Management Team (Butler) committed. Good progress was made using airtanker drops. Coyote tactics are being used on this wilderness fire.

RYAN COMPLEX, Cibola NF. Type I Incident Management Team (Denton) committed. The emphasis is to work on the south side of the Ryan fire. Steep terrain and talus slopes are making full containment difficult and slow. Crews on the Coffee Pot fire continued to construct contingency line around the fire. Expect another 4 days to finish due to heavy fuels and steep terrain in the Apache Kid Peak area.

ORGANS, Las Cruces District, BLM. The fire is burning mostly on military land. Current threats are to a visitor center and Aquirre springs.

BRIDGE, Lincoln NF. Type II Incident Management Team (Bedlion) committed. The fire is contained. Mop-up and rehabilitation will continue the next couple of days. Demobilization will begin today.

East Great Basin Large Fires:

WILLOW BASIN, Utah State and Manti-Lasal NF - Type I Incident Management Team (Birch) committed. Significant progress was made yesterday. A minor threat is to structures and the control line with predicted higher temperatures. Major concerns are possible spotting, holding control lines and minimizing impacts on the land.

DAVIS MOUNTAIN, Salt Lake District, BLM Utah. Fence lines and possibly a RAWS station have been burned. The fire is burning in flashy grass and sage fuels. Today's fire behavior expected to intensify due to a decrease in relative humidities and increased temperatures and winds. Remaining threats include rangeland habitats, cattle and fence lines.

California Large Fires:

LAKELAND, California State. The fire has been declared contained and heavy demobilization is underway.

Alaska Large Fires:

413212, Alaska State. Type II Incident Management Team (Dash) has been released. The fire has received some precipitation and cooler weather has moved into the area. Suppression operations continue with no problems reported. The fire has burned into a hazardous material area (old military dump).

401275, Alaska State. Type II Incident Management Team (Wilcock) committed. The fire continued to gain acreage yesterday. Suppression operations included line construction, hand firing, and suppression of spot fires. Aerial firing operations are planned when conditions permit. Burning conditions remain high due to windy conditions.

Outlook: A RED FLAG WATCH has been posted for northwest Arizona for strong gusty winds and low humidity. Arizona, New Mexico, Colorado, Utah and Nevada will be sunny, warm and dry with low humidities. New Mexico will have a chance of afternoon and evening thunderstorms. Southern California will be sunny and warm with less wind and low humidities in the interior deserts. Fire activity is expected to continue as no major relief in the weather is predicted. Alaska will be partly cloudy with a few showers and minimum humidities between 30-40% in the interior. Expect fire activity to moderate in Alaska.

NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL III

Current Situation: Large fire activity continued in southern California, the Rocky Mountain, Eastern Great Basin and the Southwest Areas. Four Type I Crews, two Type II Helicopters, one Type I Helicopter and a Caterer and Shower were mobilized to the Garlic fire in southern California. Miscellaneous overhead continued to be mobilized to the Southwest Area. Fire activity has moderated in Alaska due to cooler, wet weather that moved into the northern half of the state. Very high and extreme indices are being reported on numerous units in California, the Rocky Mountain, Southwest and Great Basin Areas.

Rocky Mountain Area Large Fires:

ROCK CREEK, Routt NF. Type II Incident Management Team (Hart) committed. The fire is burning in mature lodgepole pine. The incident objectives are to protect a high voltage power line, commercial timber land and riparian habitat. Firefighters will be working on reinforcing the fireline and mopping up hotspots along the line.

Southwest Area Large Fires:

PIGEON, Gila NF. Type I Incident Management Team (Shaw) committed. Successful air operations was accomplished shuttling personnel to the fire line. Airtankers were used to inhibit major fire runs. Fire behavior was reduced due to higher relative humidity and lower wind velocity. Extremely steep slopes and rockiness will slow the remaining line construction.

SPRUCE, Gila NF. Type II Incident Management Team (Butler) committed. Cloud cover and higher relative humidity allowed crews to make good progress on the fire. An increase in acreage was due to more accurate mapping. Heavy fuels and steep terrain is making mop-up operations difficult.

RYAN COMPLEX, Cibola NF. Type I Incident Management Team (Denton) committed. Crews completed line around the escape area on the Ryan fire. Bucket drops and airtankers were used to cool hotspots and stop runs within the area, assisting in the completion of the line. Crews completed approximately 5 miles of line on the Coffee Pot fire yesterday. Fire behavior has decreased due to higher relative humidity and the fire burning in an area with less fuels. Burned logs and debris continue to reburn inside talus slopes within the fireline making mop-up extremely difficult.

ORGANS, Las Cruces District, BLM. Good progress was made on the fire yesterday. Cox visitor center and historic structures appear to be secure. Line construction and burnout operations continued for protection of Aquirre Springs camp ground.

East Great Basin Large Fires:

WILLOW BASIN, Utah State and Manti-Lasal NF. Type I Incident Management Team (Birch) committed. The fire was contained yesterday. Due to strong winds a slight threat to structures and campgrounds remains. Erratic fire behavior continued again yesterday, but was confined within the fire perimeter. Major concerns include snags, high winds, low relative humidity and possible spotting across the line.

DAVIS MOUNTAIN, Salt Lake District, BLM. The fire made a 500 acre run yesterday but it is now contained and controlled.

KETTLE BUTTE, Idaho Falls District, BLM. The fire experienced erratic, unseasonable fire behavior yesterday. Two out buildings, two pieces of farm equipment and powerpoles were damaged. The fire has been declared contained.

MCINTYRE, Utah State. The fire has consumed primarily pinyon/juniper stands and rangeland. No structures were destroyed. The fire's rate of spread was rapid due to nearly constant 25-35 MPH winds during the burning period. At 1330 it was reported to be moving at approximately 1 chain every two minutes.

Alaska Large Fires:

404275, Alaska State. Type II Incident Management Team (Wilcock) committed. The fire made major runs yesterday. Crews continue to construct indirect line and burn-out and mop-up operations.

California Large Fires:

GARLIC, Sierra NF. Type II Incident Management Team (Sherwood) committed. No other information available.

Outlook: A RED FLAG WARNING has been posted for southeast Utah for lightning, low humidity and low fuel moisture. Partly cloudy southeast, mostly sunny elsewhere with continued dry and minimum humidities as low as 10 percent. A RED FLAG WATCH has been posted for southwest Colorado for dry lightning. Dry weather will continue with low humidities as low as 10 percent. Arizona and New Mexico will be partly cloudy with scattered afternoon and evening thunderstorms. Nevada will be mostly sunny, warm and dry with minimum humidities as low as 8 percent. Southern California will have increasing clouds with a chance of dry thunderstorms over the eastern deserts and a little higher humidities. The potential for new fire activity continues with above forecasted weather. The Interior of Alaska will have scattered showers and be cooler, this will decrease fire activity there.

SUNDAY 06/19/94 0900 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL III

Current Situation: Good progress was made on several large fires as they met containment yesterday. Minor demobilization of overhead from Alaska and the western U.S. is occurring through NICC. Fire activity has moderated in Alaska due to cooler, wet weather. Higher humidity and cloud cover aided firefighters on some fires in the Southwest Area. Very high and extreme indices continue to be reported on numerous units in California, Rocky Mountain, Southwest and Great Basin Areas.

Rocky Mountain Area Large Fires:

ROCK CREEK, Routt NF. Type II Incident Management Team (Hart) committed. The fire is controlled and demobilization should be complete today.

Southwest Area Large Fires:

PIGEON, Gila NF. Type I Incident Management Team (Shaw) committed. Higher relative humidity and light to moderate precipitation on parts of the fire have necessitated a change in the strategic planning. A more direct attack is planned due to present and forecasted weather conditions.

SPRUCE, Gila NF. Type II Incident Management Team (Butler) committed. Cloud cover and higher relative humidity allowed crews to make good progress. Heavy fuel concentrations and steep talus terrain are hampering mop-up operations. Containment has been set back a day due to these conditions.

RYAN COMPLEX, Cibola NF. Type I Incident Management Team (Denton) committed. Mop-up and patrol is continuing on the Ryan fire. Helicopter bucket work was used on hotspots. Crews and helicopters continue to work on hot spots and securing the line on the Coffee Pot fire.

ORGANS, Las Cruces District, BLM. The lines held under strong winds from thunderstorms yesterday. Good progress was made on the line south of Aquirre Springs campground.

East Great Basin Large Fires:

MCINTYRE, Utah State. Significant progress was made and the fire was contained last evening. High winds caused flare-ups in the interior, but no problems are expected. Demobilization is in progress.

Alaska Large Fires:

404275, Alaska State. Type II Incident Management Team (Wilcock) committed. Crews continue to build indirect line. A helitorch is being used for burnout operations which is responsible for a majority of the acreage increase.

California Large Fires:

GARLIC, Sierra NF. Type II Incident Management Team (Sherwood) committed. Steep terrain and vertical rock faces are making line construction hazardous.

Outlook: A RED FLAG WATCH has been posted for northwest and west central Colorado for dry lightning Sunday afternoon with humidities down to 10 percent. Initial attack activity is anticipated to increase in Colorado, with the potential for escaped fires. Utah, central and eastern Arizona, central and western New Mexico and Colorado will be partly cloudy with scattered afternoon and evening thundershowers. Southern California, Nevada, western Arizona and eastern New Mexico will be mostly sunny. West winds 15 to 25 MPH over the northern deserts of southern California will cause humidities to drop to 10 percent. No significant activity is expected in Alaska due to cool weather and showers. Expect demobilization to increase as fires continue to meet containment and control objectives.

NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL III

Current Situation: Progress in reaching containment targets continued in the Southwest Area due to cooler temperatures, higher relative humidity and scattered precipitation. Numerous units continue to report very high indices. Minor demobilization of overhead, airtankers, a caterer and a shower unit occurred through NICC yesterday.

The Eastern Great Basin and Rocky Mountain Areas released overhead, two caterers and a shower yesterday through NICC. Very high and extreme indices continue to be reported in Utah and Colorado.

Southwest Area Large Fires:

PIGEON, Gila NF. Type I Incident Management Team (Shaw) committed. Showers kept fire behavior low yesterday. Good progress was made using direct attack. Topographic complexities remain the primary control problem.

ORGANS, Las Cruces District, BLM. The lines held under strong winds from thunderstorms yesterday. The fire is burning actively on military land to the south. No structures are threatened at this time. Mop-up continues around areas of improvements.

Alaska Large Fires:

404275, Alaska State. Type II Incident Management Team (Wilcock) committed. Helitorch operations will continue as weather permits due to precipitation received.

Outlook: Central and eastern Arizona, central and western New Mexico, Colorado and Utah will be mostly cloudy with scattered afternoon thunderstorms. Western Arizona and eastern New Mexico will be mostly sunny, with isolated afternoon thunderstorms in eastern New Mexico. Southern and eastern Nevada and the extreme eastern deserts of southern California will be partly cloudy with a slight chance of afternoon thunderstorms. Initial attack activity may increase in the above Areas with the forecasted thunderstorms. Demobilization on large fires will increase as fires continue to meet containment targets. Alaska will be cool with continued rain; no significant activity is anticipated.

NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

Current Situation: Containment targets continued to be met in the Southwest Area with cooler temperatures, higher relative humidity and scattered precipitation. Numerous units continue to report very high indices. Demobilization of resources increased yesterday through NICC. Favorable weather and availability of initial attack resources are keeping new starts at minimal acreages.

Very high and extreme indices were reported in the Great Basin, Rocky Mountain and California.

Cool and wet weather conditions persist in Alaska, diminishing new fire activity. Acreage increases continue to be reported on ongoing, mainly limited fires. There are 48 limited suppression fires burning for a total of 72,870 acres.

Southwest Area Large Fires:

PIGEON, Gila NF. Type I Incident Management Team (Shaw) committed. Burnout operations were suspended yesterday due to spotting despite moderate humidities. Hand crews and an airtanker caught a spot fire. Demobilization of some crews and overhead is scheduled for today.

ORGANS, Las Cruces District, BLM. The southern edge of the fire is the only portion that is uncontained. If this portion of the fire does not hold at natural barriers overnight, a successful burn-out operation should then bring containment. Four Type I Crews are scheduled for demobilization this morning.

Alaska Large Fires:

404275, Alaska State. Type II Incident Management Team (Wilcock) committed. Weather permitted building direct line on the north side of the fire. Mop-up and line construction continue.

Outlook: Arizona, New Mexico, Colorado and Utah will have scattered afternoon and evening thunderstorms. Highs will range from the 70's and 80's in the mountains and 90's to 110 in the deserts. Successful initial attack activity is expected to continue. Nevada will have widely scattered thunderstorms east and will be sunny west and central. Minimum humidities will be down to 5-10% with high temperatures in the 90's to 110. Southern California will have a few thunderstorms in the far eastern deserts, otherwise sunny except for low clouds and fog along the coast. Minimum humidities will be down to 8% with southwest winds 12-25 mph in the deserts. Highs will be in the 80's mountains to 110 in the deserts. No significant activity is anticipated in southern California and Nevada. Alaska will be partly cloudy north with rain in the south. Highs will be in the 50's. New fire activity is expected to be minimal.

Current Situation: Cold and wet weather persists in Alaska with demobilization taking place on most fires. All staffed fires are now contained except 404275.

An increase in fire activity was reported in the Great Basin and Northern Rockies due to lightning. Nevada has several units reporting extreme indices, while Utah only has one unit still reporting very high.

Increased initial attack with one escaped fire in South Zone California necessitated the movement of three airtankers from the Southwest Area. One radio system, one shower unit and one type II helicopter were mobilized through NICC.

Demobilization of contained large fires is continuing in the Southwest Area. Favorable weather and available initial attack resources have kept new starts at minimal acreages.

South Zone Large Fires:

WHITE BLANKET, Kern County, Sequoia NF and Bakersfield District, BLM. The fires is 2,500 acres and has potential to reach 10,000 acres if it burns into the Dome Land Wilderness.

Southwest Area Large Fires:

PIGEON, Gila NF. Type I Incident Management Team (Shaw) committed. The fire perimeter has at least a scratch line around it, 45% of the perimeter needs to be improved and secured with a black line. Spotting continues to be a problem despite precipitation and higher humidities. Containment has been set back to 6/26 from 6/22.

ORGAN, Las Cruces District, BLM. Two airtankers, one helicopter and ground forces were used on the south flank to contain hotspots. Acreage increase was due to southward movement and remapping the fire perimeter using GPS.

Outlook: Arizona, New Mexico, Colorado and Utah will have scattered afternoon and evening thunderstorms with high temperatures in the 70's and 80's in the mountains and 90's to 110 in the deserts. Eastern Nevada will have a few thunderstorms, west and central Nevada will be sunny with highs in the 90's to 110. Southern California will have a few thunderstorms over the eastern deserts, otherwise sunny with minimum humidities down to 8 percent. Potential for increasing fire activity exists in the above areas. Alaska will continue to be partly cloudy with showers, highs will be in the 50's.

Current Situation: Resource mobilization increased to California South Zone in support of the White fire. Twelve Type I Crews, a Type II Helicopter, one ATMU, one Caterer and two Shower units were mobilized through NICC. A Type I Incident Management Team was committed internally.

Increased initial attack activity was experienced in most of the western geographic areas. Very high to extreme indices are being reported in Utah, Nevada, Wyoming, New Mexico, Arizona and California. Three Airtankers were mobilized through NICC to the Northwest Area for initial attack.

California - South Zone Large Fires:

WHITE, Sequoia NF. A Type I Team (Harbour) has been assigned and will assume command of the fire at 0600 this morning. This human caused fire is burning in the Dome Land Wilderness, approximately 25 miles northeast of Lake Isabella. The fire has now split into two heads and has spread into the wilderness area and canyons to the north and west, burning in extremely steep rocky, inaccessible terrain. The south flank of the fire is holding from line construction.

Southwest Area Large Fires:

PIGEON, Gila NF. Type I Incident Management Team (Shaw) committed. Mop-up is slow due to the topography. The number of spike camps have been reduced, which will free up aircraft for mop-up and holding, instead of logistical support. Winds today will test the containment lines.

ORGAN, Las Cruces District, BLM. A burnout operation stopped the spread of the fire at Rucker and Soledad Canyons. Acreage increase was due to burnout operation and remapping using GPS.

Outlook: Utah and Nevada will be sunny with highs 85 to 95 and 100 to 115 in southern Nevada. Arizona will be Sunny, except partly cloudy in the extreme east with highs in the 80's in the mountains and 95 to near 110 in the deserts. New Mexico will be mostly sunny, except for isolated thundershowers. Highs will be in the mid 80's to near 100 and upper 70's to lower 80's in the mountains. Colorado will be partly cloudy with widely scattered thundershowers. Highs will be in the 80's to lower 90's and mid 70's to lower 80's in the mountains. Southern California will be sunny with highs in the 70's near the coast to near 100 for the inland valleys, 100 to 110 in the deserts, and 85 to 95 in the mountains. Expect initial attack activity to continue with the potential for extended attack and escaped fires throughout most of the western states.

Current Situation: Initial attack activity was reported in the Northern Rockies, Northwest and the Great Basin from lightning, dry, hot, and windy conditions.

Demobilization of overhead continued from the Southwest Area and in southern California. One caterer, one shower and communications equipment were ordered for the Highline Fire on the Tonto National forest.

South Zone is experiencing initial attack activity with one large fire and demob taking place on the White Fire.

ORGAN, Las Cruces District, BLM. A burnout operation stopped the spread of the fire at Rucker and Soledad Canyons. Acreage increase was due to burnout operation and remapping using GPS.

Western Great Basin Large Fires:

HOPPIE CANYON, Elko District, BLM. The fire is 50% contained. Despite flareups within the perimeter good line building progress was made.

BOARD, Ely District, BLM. The fire is 10% contained. The fire is located near the Great Basin National Park. The fire was very active due to high temperatures and winds, and low humidities.

Outlook: A RED FLAG WARNING for the western Utah valleys for dry and breezy conditions. Hot, dry, windy and low relative humidities in southern California, southern Nevada, southern Utah and Arizona. Temperatures will rise to near 120 degrees in the warmest deserts of Arizona. Isolated dry afternoon thunderstorms are expected over north central Colorado and the higher terrain of Utah. Little or no convection will occur over the remainder of the region.

NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

Current Situation: Initial attack activity increased in several areas in the western states due to hot, dry and breezy conditions. Eight smokejumpers were mobilized to the Rocky Mountain from the Western Great Basin.

South Zone is having initial attack and large fire activity and has ordered 5 type I crews, 20 type II crews, 5 airtankers and 2 shower units. A type II team has been committed internally.

The Southwest Area is mobilizing to the Ryan Complex again, due to problems on the Coffee Pot fire. The Southwest Area has ordered 1 type I helicopter, 5 type I crews, 1 type II helicopter, 1 caterer, 1 shower and 2 communication systems. A type II incident management team has been assigned internally.

California - South Zone Large Fires:

SCOUT, Angeles NF. The fire is located 3 miles north of Wrightwood. Six structures (type unknown) were destroyed in the fire's initial run.

Southwest Area Large Fires:

RYAN COMPLEX, Cibola NF. Type II Incident Management Team (Blackwell) committed. The complex is comprised of the Coffee Pot and Ryan fires. Significant activity on the Coffee Pot fire yesterday was due to near record temperatures, low humidity and gusty afternoon winds. No information on new acres burned.

Outlook: A RED FLAG WARNING has been posted for southeastern Utah and western Utah valleys for hot, dry and breezy conditions. A RED FLAG WATCH has been posted for southern Idaho for strong gusty winds and low humidities. Hot and dry conditions will prevail with low relative humidities over the southwestern U.S. A low pressure system is moving across the northwestern U.S. bringing strong gusty winds and a little cooler temperatures, however, conditions will remain quite dry.

NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL III

Current Situation: Fire activity increased throughout the western U.S. Numerous units are reporting very high and extreme fire indices in the Great Basin, Rocky Mountain, Southwest and California. Type I crews and airtankers are in critical need. Type I and Type II helicopters that are available are long distances away.

Fire activity continues to increase in California due to winds, low humidity and extremely high temperatures. South Zone has ordered 7 type II helicopters, 6 type I helicopters, 2 type I crews and 23 type II crews, 1 caterer and 1 shower unit. Eight MAFFS have been activated for fires in California.

The Rocky Mountain Area experienced an increase in activity necessitating the mobilization of 2 type II helicopters, 8 smokejumpers and 2 airtankers.

California

South Zone Large Fires:

SCOUT, Angeles NF and San Bernardino R.U., California State. Type II Incident Management Team (Cooney) is committed. Activity yesterday afternoon on the southern edge of the fire resulted in the evacuation of 60-80 homes in Wrightwood. Another 3,400 homes, a jet propulsion lab and radio facility were threatened. The 22 structures that burned were: 9 homes, 1 mobile home and 12 outbuildings.

SHOOTING, Angeles NF and L.A. County. Type II Incident Management Team (Motschall) is committed. The Little Rock recreational area and scattered residences along the outskirts of Palmdale are threatened. In a worst case scenario, field reports indicate the fire has the potential to burn 16,000 acres.

BAILEY, Riverside Ranger Unit, California State. High winds and heavy fire activity yesterday afternoon led to spotting over the southern edge. Structures in the area of Chapman and Rosemond Hills are threatened. This fire has the potential to reach 4,000 to 5,000 acres prior to control.

SECOND, Cleveland NF and San Diego County. Type I Incident Management Team (Dougherty) is committed. Severe fire behavior was expected through the night, with structure protection in the Mesa Grande area and north of Angel Mountain becoming a priority.

HUNTER, Madera-Mariposa Ranger Unit, California State. This fire is located 15 miles northwest of Mariposa and is threatening the community of Hunter's Valley and wildland areas.

North Zone Large Fires:

CORPORATION, Modoc NF. Type II Incident Management Team (Duke) is committed. Severe spotting occurring up to 1/2 mile ahead of the fire. Patterson campground has been evacuated and closed until further notice.

Southwest Area Large Fires:

RYAN COMPLEX, Cibola NF. Type II Incident Management Team (Blackwell) is committed. The complex is comprised of the Coffee Pot and Ryan fires. Near record temperatures, low humidity and gusty afternoon winds caused significant activity on the fire yesterday afternoon.

Rocky Mountain Area Large Fires:

MEXICAN RIDGE, Colorado State and Craig District, BLM. Type II Incident Management Team (Adams) will take over the fire this morning. The fire is burning in dense, dry spruce and fir with significant downfall near Waldon, CO.

Outlook: Hot and dry conditions will prevail with low relative humidities over the southwestern U.S. The northwestern portion of the U.S. will be warming after the passage of a cold front with slightly calmer winds. Afternoon thunderstorms are expected over portions of Utah and New Mexico. Extreme fire behavior is expected to continue on large fires. Initial attack activity will probably escalate with continued hot and dry weather conditions. Competition for resources may occur if fire activity sustains.

NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL III

Current Situation: Fire activity increased in most of the western Geographic Areas again yesterday. Very high and extreme fire indices are being reported on many more units. A drawdown on initial attack resources is occurring in several areas. Several national resources are in high demand and shortages are occurring.

Fire activity continued to increase in California. South Zone has ordered 5 type II helicopters, 2 type I helicopters, 1 caterer and 2 shower units.

The Rocky Mountain Area again experienced an increase in activity. One crew, 2 caterers and 2 engines have been ordered.

Increased fire activity in the Eastern Great Basin necessitated the ordering of 3 crews, 2 caterers and 2 shower units.

The Northwest experienced increased activity in southern Oregon. Three airtankers, 2 type I helicopters, 1 type II helicopter, 1 caterer and 1 shower unit have been ordered.

Northwest Large Fires:

CHILOQUIN COMPLEX, Winema NF and Oregon State. Type II Incident Management Team (Bright) committed. This complex consists of three large fires and a two smaller ones. The fires are located near Chiloquin, Oregon and are threatening homes in the area.

Eastern Great Basin Large Fires:

BOY SCOUT, Wasatch-Cache NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Martin) has been committed. The fire is located approximately 20 miles southwest of Evanston, Wyoming and is burning in Douglas Fir and Lodgepole Pine stands.

COALBED, Moab District, BLM. A Type II Incident Management Team (Fitzgerald) has been committed. The fire is located approximately 40 miles southeast of Monticello, Utah. Fire increased from 8 acres to 700 acres in 5 hours.

California

South Zone Large Fires:

GIBBEL, Riverside R.U., California State. This new fire briefly threatened the Ramona Bowl near Hemet.

LUCAS COMPLEX, Sequoia NF. This fire is on the north slope of Breckenridge Mountain; a result of 5 lightning fires burning together. A Forest Service lookout and 30-40 recreation residences were threatened yesterday.

FAIRVIEW, Riverside R.U., California State. This new fire near Hemet on the west side of Bautista Canyon threatened numerous structures before it spread southward.

BAILEY, Riverside R.U., California State. The fire has doubled in size.

PEAK, Sequoia NF. This fire is located north of the Kern River and has not received much attention because it's a lower priority than the Lucas Complex south of the river.

SECOND, Cleveland NF and San Diego County. Type I Incident Management Team (Dougherty) is committed. High temperatures, low humidities and rugged terrain are hampering firefighters efforts.

Southwest Area Large Fires:

RYAN COMPLEX, Cibola NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Blackwell) is committed. Burn-out operations were planned for last night, afternoon winds, high temperatures and low humidities are preventing day firing operations. Gusty winds are causing severe burning conditions.

Rocky Mountain Area Large Fires:

BUNIGER, Grand Junction District, BLM. A Type II Incident Management Team (Hart) is committed. The fire is burning northwest of Grand Junction, CO in dense stands of pinon juniper, oak and Douglas Fir. The fire is experiencing erratic fire behavior.

Outlook: A RED FLAG WATCH has been posted for southeast Utah for hot, dry, breezy conditions and the threat of dry thunderstorms. Continued hot, dry, windy conditions and low relative humidities are expected in the southwestern U.S. Expect warm and mostly dry conditions in the Northwestern U.S. Isolated afternoon thunderstorms with very little moisture are expected over the higher terrain of Utah, north central Colorado, New Mexico, southeastern Arizona, southern Idaho and southern California.

WEDNESDAY 06/29/94 0530 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL III

Current Situation: Fire activity continued to increase in most of the western Geographic Areas again yesterday. Very high and extreme fire indices are being reported on several more units. A lack of initial attack and several national resources is hampering suppression efforts in most areas with fire activity.

National resource mobilization continued, although not as intense as the past few days, and that was mainly due to a lack of resources. Type I crews, medium helicopters, airtankers and miscellaneous overhead are in short supply.

Northwest Large Fires:

CHILOQUIN COMPLEX, Winema NF and Oregon State. Type II Incident Management Team (Bright) committed. This complex consists of three large fires and two smaller ones. The fires are located near Chiloquin, OR. Fires are all lined, blacked and in heavy mop up. Demobilization should start today or Thursday.

Western Great Basin Large Fires:

RATTLESNAKE, Las Vegas District, BLM. The fire is burning in the Gold Butte Wilderness Study Area in the Caliente Resource Area. Major threats are the WSA and Desert Tortoise habitat. The strategy was to use natural barriers and roads to burn out reporting erratic fire behavior with flame lengths up to 50 feet. All crews have been pulled from the line.

Eastern Great Basin Large Fires:

BOY SCOUT, Wasatch-Cache NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Martin) is committed. Crews and air support have been able to hold the fire with little additional acreage lost. Spots ahead of the main fire are a concern. Retardant and water drops successfully held spots through the burning period yesterday. Structures and the Boy Scout Camp are currently not threatened.

COALBED, Moab District, BLM. A Type II Incident Management Team (Fitzgerald) is committed. No significant problems occurred yesterday.

California

South Zone Large Fires:

LUCAS COMPLEX, Sequoia NF. A Type I Incident Management Team (Harbour) is committed. This complex now includes the Peak fire.

SECOND, Cleveland NF and San Diego County. A Type I Incident Management Team (Dougherty) is committed. High temperatures, low humidities and rugged terrain are hampering firefighters efforts.

Southwest Area Large Fires:

PECK FIRE, Prescott NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (McGiver) committed. Another fire called CATCLAW is also being managed by this team.

PERKINS COMPLEX, Phoenix District, BLM. A Type II Incident Management Team (Whitney) is committed. The fire made major runs this afternoon, threatening subdivisions to the southeast. Serious control problems on the south and east flanks. Resource shortages are hampering suppression efforts.

COYOTE COMPLEX, Phoenix District, BLM. A Type II Incident Management Team is committed. This afternoon the community of Dolan, AZ., was evacuated, this involved approximately 100 people. No other information at this time.

JURASSIC FIRE, Phoenix District. BLM and Arizona State. There have been 12-15 homes evacuated, approximately 50 people. One home has been destroyed, and 2 are immediately threatened. A subdivision is threatened by the south and east spread of the fire.

RYAN COMPLEX, Cibola NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Blackwell) is committed. Burn-out operations are continuing. Weather conditions continue to be a problem.

GAP FIRE, Lincoln NF. High winds and low relative humidities are hampering control efforts. Three structures were threatened for a short time.

Rocky Mountain Area Large Fires:

BUNIGER, Grand Junction District, BLM. A Type II Incident Management Team (Hart) is committed. Steep, inaccessible terrain and heavy fuels are hindering suppression work. There was heavy use of airtankers and helicopters yesterday. Firelines held with moderate activity.

FLETCHER II, Craig District, BLM. Good progress was made by hand crews. A flare up on the southeast perimeter delayed containment.

MORGAN and COX, Southern Ute Agency, BIA. The Cox fire was held by use of airtankers. Structural plan is in place for Bondad. Fires are located in a high cultural resource area, all line construction must be approved by archeologists.

Outlook: A RED FLAG WATCH has been posted in Utah for hot and dry conditions along with dry thunderstorms. The southwestern U.S. will continue to be hot and dry with low relative humidities, thunderstorms will continue to develop. The Northwestern U.S. will be warm and mostly dry with a few clouds. Initial attack activity will continue in most of the western states. Large fires will continue to be active.

NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL III

Current Situation: Initial attack and new large fires continued in California, Rocky Mountain, Great Basin and Southwest areas. Fire indices are very high and extreme in most areas of the Southwest, Great Basin, Rocky Mountain and California.

Initial attack resources are stretched thin in most areas. Competition continues for Type I crews, airtankers, and medium helicopters. Containment was achieved on several fires, however; resources are being reassigned as fast as they are released.

NICC continues to mobilize resources to the Southwest, Great Basin, Rocky Mountain, and California.

Northwest Large Fires:

CHILOQUIN COMPLEX, Winema NF and Oregon State. 1,500 acres. Type II Incident Management Team (Bright) committed. Fires are contained and heavy demob will begin today.

Western Great Basin Large Fires:

RATTLESNAKE, Las Vegas District, BLM, 5,700 acres. The fire is burning in the Gold Butte Wilderness Study Area in the Caliente Resource Area. Major threats are the WSA and Desert Tortoise habitat. Slow arduous line construction has delayed the projected containment date until 6/30. High temperatures are significantly impacting personnel performance. Air tanker drops were effective in holding the line this afternoon.

Eastern Great Basin Large Fires:

BOY SCOUT, Wasatch-Cache NF, 425 acres. A Type II Incident Management Team (Martin) is committed. Suppression strategies are working as planned and line construction is on schedule. A new human caused fire was discovered a half mile from ICP with considerable potential, but was suppressed quickly. Numerous spots outside of the line continue to show up.

COALBED, Moab District, BLM, 970 acres. A Type II Incident Management Team (Fitzgerald) is committed. Incident personnel discovered and suppressed two nearby ignitions and provided initial attack on the nearby Mustang incident. Some flare-ups within the lines from gusty winds, high temperatures and low relative humidities occurred.

BITTER CREEK, Moab District, BLM, 3,500 acres. A Type II Incident Management Team (Williams) will take over the fire this morning. A natural gas well and drip gas storage tank are on fire. Current threats are to gas wells, pipelines and storage tanks. X

MARBLE CANYON, Utah State, 450 acres. The fire is located approximately 20 miles east of Ogden and is threatening structures.

MUSTANG, Moab District, BLM, 440 acres. The fire caused the evacuation of a campground and threatened residents, archeological sites and powerlines.

California

South Zone Large Fires:

LUCAS COMPLEX, Sequoia NF, 6,960 acres, A Type I Incident Management Team (Harbour) is committed. This complex includes the Lucas and Peak fires. High temperatures are significantly impacting personnel performance. Containment has been moved back a day due to a 200 acre slopover.

SECOND, Cleveland NF and San Diego County, 4,700 acres, a Type I Incident Management Team (Dougherty) is committed. Losses include the habitat of two threatened and endangered birds, the Gnat Catcher and Least Bell's Vireo.

BAILEY, Riverside Ranger Unit, California State, 6,420 acres. Tuesday afternoon while firing a control line, the wind shifted resulting in a 760 acre slopover. One dozer deployed it's curtain, 1 Captain and 5 inmates on the Cuesta crew deployed their shelters. No one was injured. Adverse weather conditions yesterday slowed line construction, resulting in containment being pushed back a day.

COPPER COMPLEX, Calaveras County, California State, 3,250 acres. The complex consists of 5 fires. Two mobile homes have been destroyed and the fire is heading toward the town of Cooperopolis. Evacuations and road closures took place yesterday afternoon.

PIUTE COMPLEX, California Desert District, BLM, 3,500 acres. Three large fires and 14 smaller ones are included in this complex. Only 3 of the fires have resources assigned. Extreme fire behavior and temperatures of 120+ are creating suppression problems. All line was lost yesterday afternoon. A Type II Incident Management Team will be assigned to the fire this morning.

Southwest Area Large Fires:

f RATON, Cibola NF, 50-75 acres. A Type II Incident Management Team (Bedlion) is committed. This fire is burning in heavy slash and is threatening private land, a game refuge and lodge.

ORACLE, Arizona State, 1,200 acres. Fire spread was rapid due to the weather conditions. Power transmission lines serving San Manual mine were threatened early yesterday morning.

y CATCLAW COMPLEX, Prescott NF, 800 acres. A Type II Incident Management Team (Butler) is committed. This complex is comprised of two fires, the Catclaw at 300 acres and the Peck at 500 acres. The Peck fire made some late afternoon runs yesterday. No crews will be out on the line tonight due to safety reasons. Structures and private land are threatened.

RYAN COMPLEX, Cibola NF, 24,800 acres. A Type II Incident Management Team (Blackwell) is committed. Burnout of 320 acres of potential trouble spots were burned yesterday. Lines were reinforced and mop-up continued. Ground and aerial ignition is being used to burn out unburned islands.

TANGLE, Tonto NF, 2,000 acres. The fire is threatening private property and a riparian area.

PERKINS COMPLEX, Phoenix District, BLM, 25,946 acres. A Type II Incident Management Team (Whitney) is committed. The fire is contained. Large acreage increase is due to firing operation from indirect attack.

JURASSIC, Phoenix District, BLM and Arizona State, 3,385 acres. The fire is contained and evacuees are returning to their homes.

Rocky Mountain Area Large Fires:

BUNIGER, Grand Junction District, BLM, 1,600 acre. A Type II Incident Management Team (Hart) is committed. This fire is burning in scrub oak and pinon-juniper approximately 24 miles northwest of Grand Junction, CO. Multiple retardant drops aided suppression efforts. Bruce Babbitt, U.S. Secretary of the Interior, was included as a member of a hotshot crew yesterday. The Secretary, wanting actual firefighting experience, went out at 0800 and returned with the crew at 1915 for dinner.

Outlook: A strong high pressure system centered over southern Arizona and New Mexico has brought near record heat to the desert southwest and southern California. Temperatures in the deserts are expected to reach 125 degrees. The remainder of the west is influenced by a Pacific frontal system which will bring cooler temperatures to the interior. Initial attack and large fires are expected to continue as adverse weather conditions prevail.
