*** SAFETY COMES FIRST ON EVERY FIRE, EVERY TIME ***

Current Situation: Initial attack activity continued across the western U.S. Numerous units in Arizona and southern California continue to report very high and extreme fire indices. South Zone California continues to experience short-duration large fire activity at the lower elevations. Three airtankers were mobilized to the Southwest Area.

Outlook: A strong upper ridge of high pressure remains centered over the desert Southwest. Another series of weak upper level troughs will move into the Pacific Northwest and northern Rockies. Hot and dry conditions are forecast for Arizona, Nevada and California. Isolated to scattered afternoon and evening thunderstorms are expected in southern Oregon, Montana, Wyoming, Colorado and northeast New Mexico. An onshore flow will result in mostly cloudy skies and showers in western Washington and western Oregon. High temperatures will range from the mid 60's and 70's in western Washington and western Oregon, to 110 and 115 in the desert southwest. The remainder of the

West will have highs in the 80's and 90's. Moderate initial attack activity is expected to continue. The potential for escaped large fires in southern California is increasing.
