Current Situation: Fire activity remained at a moderate level throughout the U.S.

Eastern Area Large Fires:

SAG CORRIDOR, Superior NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Tarbell) is assigned. The fire has burned 3,900 acres in the U.S. and 8,700 acres in Canada. The U.S. portion of the fire is 100% contained and the Canadian side is 80% contained. U.S. crews worked in Division E on the Canadian side of the fire yesterday.

OUTLOOK: An upper ridge of high pressure will build over the Great Basin and Northern Rockies. An upper trough will approach the northwest Washington coast. Monsoon moisture will spread showers and thundershowers from Arizona and New Mexico into eastern Utah, Colorado and southeast Wyoming. Oregon, California, Nevada, Idaho, Montana, western Wyoming and northern Utah will be sunny and warmer. Washington will have some clouds along the coast with sunny and warmer weather east of the Cascades. In the West, high temperatures will range from the 70's and 80's in the northern states to the 90's to over 100 degrees in the southern states. Northern Minnesota will be sunny, breezy and less humid. Highs will be in the upper 70's with northwest winds 15-25 MPH. Fire activity is expected to remain low.
