

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT  
WEDNESDAY, MARCH 6, 1996 - 0530 MST  
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION: Fire activity was moderate throughout most of the Southern Area, with the exception of Florida which experienced increased activity. Resource mobilization through NICC was minimal.

Southern Area Fire Information:

ADA COMPLEX, Muskogee Area Office, Ada Agency, BIA. A Type I Incident Management Team (O'Bannon) is assigned. Four new fires were reported in the complex yesterday.

NORTHEAST OKLAHOMA COMPLEX. A Type II Incident Management Team (Kearney) is assigned. Fire activity decreased yesterday due to cooler temperatures and higher humidities. Five new fires were detected in the protection area.

CARD SOUND COMMAND, Florida State. A State Incident Management Team has been ordered. Winds continued to push the fire yesterday, periodically closing Highway 1. Everglades NP is threatened although the fire has not burned into the park.

GLOBE/GAP MOUNTAIN COMPLEX, North Carolina NF's. A Type II Incident Management Team (Leech) is assigned. All fires in the complex are contained.

Due to the number of new fires added to the Ada Complex, the percent contained and containment dates have not been determined.

OUTLOOK: Florida will be partly cloudy and breezy. High temperatures will be in the upper 70's to mid 80's with southeast winds at 10-20 MPH. North Carolina will be mostly cloudy and breezy with a chance of showers. High temperatures will be 65 to 75 with southwest winds at 15-30 MPH. Texas, Oklahoma and Arkansas will be mostly cloudy and windy with a chance of showers and thunderstorms. Snow showers are possible in parts of Oklahoma. Temperatures will be in the 50's to 70's falling into the 30's and 50's as low pressure pushes a strong cold front into the area. Cooler temperatures and precipitation will reduce fire activity in Texas and Oklahoma. Fire activity is expected to continue in Florida.
