 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

\*\*\* SAFETY COMES FIRST ON EVERY FIRE, EVERY TIME \*\*\*

CURRENT SITUATION: Two new fires were reported yesterday in southern California. Favorable weather conditions allowed good progress on several of the large fires in California. Resource mobilization through NICC remained minimal.

Southern California Large Fires:

SUR, Los Padres NF. A Type I Incident Management Team (Giachino) is assigned. Good progress continued on line construction. Structure protection remains in place in the Pfeifer Big Sur State Park, along the North Coast Ridge Road and Highway 1. Demobilization is expected to begin tomorrow.

CALABASAS, Los Angeles County, California. The fire experienced strong northeast winds yesterday. The fire was not declared contained due to winds and hotspots inside control lines. Good progress continues on mop-up operations. Additional demobilization will begin today.

Otay #322, San Diego Ranger Unit, California State. The fire received significant rainfall Friday night. Full containment was expected last night. Heavy demobilization is anticipated today.

WATERMAN #3, San Bernardino NF. The fire is located 1 mile north of San Bernardino, CA. Strong winds hindered suppression efforts. Residents on the north end of San Bernardino were evacuated early this morning. No other information available.

SIERRA, Riverside Ranger Unit, California State. The fire is located 1 mile west of Riverside, CA. Wind gusts of up to 20 MPH have hindered containment objectives. No other information available.
