

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 10, 1999 - 0530 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL III

CURRENT SITUATION:

Initial attack activity was minimal. New large fire activity was reported in the Western Great Basin. Large fire activity continued in California and the Eastern Areas. The National Interagency Coordination Center mobilized infrared aircraft, helicopters, smokejumper aircraft, engines, telecommunications equipment, crews, and miscellaneous overhead. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Oregon, Washington, California, Montana, Idaho, Utah, Nevada, South Dakota, Wyoming, Kentucky, Mississippi, Tennessee, and Texas.

NORTHERN CALIFORNIA LARGE FIRES:

MHRD COMPLEX, Plumas National Forest. A Type I Incident Management Team (Giachino) is assigned. Crews continued to work on improving firelines and burnout on the Bucks fire. Favorable weather conditions allowed crews to go more direct on the fire's edge.

BIG BAR COMPLEX, Shasta-Trinity National Forest. A Type II Incident Management Team (Bacon) is assigned. This complex is 28 miles northwest of Weaverville, CA. The complex consists of three lightning-ignited fires; the Onion (13,644 acres), Fawn (5,464 acres) and Soldier/Megram (2,364 acres). Very active burning within the fireline and slopovers are occurring.

STEIN, Klamath National Forest. A Type I Incident Management Team (Studebaker) is assigned. This fire is in the Marble Mountain Wilderness Area, twelve miles northeast of Forks of the Salmon, CA. Limited suppression action is being taken on the fire, due to safety concerns with heavy concentration of snags and downed timber.

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA LARGE FIRES:

RICH BAR COMPLEX, Sequoia National Forest. A Type II Incident Management Team (Roach) is assigned. This complex consists of seven fires in the vicinity of Kern Canyon, 15 miles northeast of Bakersfield, CA. The fires are burning in grass, brush, and oak trees. Containment was expected last night.

KIRK, Las Padres National Forest. This fire is at Pacific Coast Highway 1

and Nacimiento road. Current threats include Kirk Creek Campground and Limekiln State Park.

BRUNEAU, Humboldt-Toiyabe National Forest. This fire is 70 miles north of Elko, NV. Steep terrain and difficult access are hampering initial attack forces and elk habitat is threatened.

OUTLOOK:

An upper level trough will move across northern Idaho and into Montana. A surface cold front will move through Montana and Wyoming. Isolated showers are expected over the mountains of northern Idaho and northwest Montana. Ahead of the cold front there will be widely scattered showers and thunderstorms over southeast Montana, Wyoming and southeastern Idaho. East of the Rocky Mountains over Montana and Wyoming, winds will be westerly at 15 to 20 MPH. Mostly sunny and cooler conditions with highs in the 70's, will prevail over southwest Idaho, Oregon and Washington. The Great Basin will be partly to mostly cloudy with some dry isolated thunderstorms over Nevada. Thunderstorms will be scattered over Utah and western Colorado and the region's lowest minimum relative humidity will be 15 to 20 percent. High temperatures will be mostly in the 80's.

California will be mostly sunny west of the Sierra Nevadas, with a slight chance of thunderstorms. Southern California will be partly cloudy with a

slight chance of showers. High temperatures will be in the 70's on the coast, to the lower 90's inland. Minimum relative humidity will be 15 to 30 percent.

Southwestern states will be partly cloudy with a slight chance of thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the 80's and 90's.

Texas will be partly cloudy to mostly sunny. High temperatures will be in the 90's.

New York will be cloudy with rain showers. High temperatures will be in the 70's.
