

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT  
 MONDAY, OCTOBER 30, 2000 - 0730 MDT  
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL I

CURRENT SITUATION:

Three new large fires were reported, two in the Southern Area and one in the Eastern Area. One of the fires in the Southern Area was contained yesterday. Initial attack activity was moderate in the Southern Area and light elsewhere in the nation. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Georgia.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

BRUSHY RIDGE, National Forests in North Carolina. A Type I Incident Management Team (Melton) is assigned. This fire is burning 15 miles northeast of Marion, NC. Steep terrain and low relative humidity are causing containment problems. Burnout operations are continuing along Highway 105.

EASTERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

HUZZAH, Mark Twain National Forest. This fire is five miles southwest of Viburnum, MO. Steep terrain and difficult access are contributing to containment problems.

DISWOOD, Shawnee National Forest. The fire is burning in leaf litter four miles north of Olive Branch, IL. Snags, steep terrain and rolling material are slowing mopup efforts.

OUTLOOK:

A strong storm system moving out of the central Great Plains will bring rain and wet thunderstorms to Missouri and Illinois. A moist flow out of the southwest will continue through Monday. High temperatures will be in

the 70's with a minimum relative humidity between 65 to 75 percent.

Upper level high pressure remains over Mississippi, however moist air and a weak weather disturbance will produce mostly cloudy skies and scattered afternoon wet thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the mid to upper 70's. Relative humidity will be 55 to 65 percent. Winds will be southwest 5 to 10 mph except stronger near thunderstorms.

Dry weather continues in the Carolina's with temperatures in the mid 60's to 70's. Relative humidity will be in the mid 20 percent range with winds out of the northwest at 5 to 10 mph.
