

**INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
THURSDAY SEPTEMBER 30, 2004 – 0530 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 2**

CURRENT SITUATION:

Initial attack activity was light nationally, with 135 new fires were reported. One large fire was contained in the Northwest Area. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Alaska, Arizona, California, Nebraska and Nevada.

Presidential Disaster Declarations have been issued for Hurricane Frances in Florida on 9/4; for Hurricane Ivan in Alabama, Florida, Louisiana and Mississippi on 9/16; and for Hurricane Jeanne in Florida on 9/26. An Area Command Team (Ribar) is assigned to the Florida Disaster Field Office, Orlando, FL. An Area Command Team (Zimmerman) has been ordered. Numerous resources have been mobilized as part of the relief effort, including aviation assets, mobile caterers and showers, national buying teams, crews and miscellaneous overhead personnel.

SOUTHERN AREA INCIDENTS:

HURRICANE FRANCES / IVAN RESPONSE, Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). A transfer of command from a Type 1 Incident Management Team (Bennett) to a Type 1 Incident Management Team (Hart) will occur today. The Team is managing a base camp at Saufley Field Naval Air Station in Pensacola, FL. A Georgia Type 2 Incident Management Team (Cline) is assigned to Saufley Field Naval Air Station in Pensacola, FL, and is supporting the receiving and distribution of relief supplies. A Type 1 Incident Management Team (Sexton) is managing an Operational Staging Area at Maxwell Air Force Base, Montgomery, AL. Closure of the Operational Staging Area will occur tomorrow. A transfer of command from a Type 1 Incident Management Team (Anderson) to a Type 3 organization will occur today. The Team is assigned in Milton, FL, and is managing a base camp and supporting the receiving and distribution of supplies. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Mullenix) is managing a base camp, supporting the receiving and distribution of supplies and debris removal in central Alabama. A transfer of command from a Type 1 Incident Management Team (Lohrey) to a Type 3 organization has occurred. A transfer of command from a North Carolina Type 2 Incident Management Team (Houseman) to a Type 1 Incident Management Team (Frye) will occur today. The Team is assigned to the Jacksonville Naval Air Station, Jacksonville, FL, and is supporting the receiving and distribution of relief supplies.

HURRICANE JEANNE RESPONSE, Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). A Type 1 Incident Management Team (Kearney) is assigned in Martin County, FL and will manage a 500 person base camp.

HURRICANE JEANNE RECOVERY, State of Florida. Three Florida Division of Forestry Type 2 Incident Management Teams (Beauchamp, Johnson and Jones) are assigned in Indian River, St. Lucie and Polk Counties, FL, and are managing the distribution of relief supplies.

Weather Discussion: An upper low pressure system over the Great Basin will continue to produce scattered thunderstorms from the Sierra to Rockies, including Arizona and New Mexico. A cold front dropping down out of Canada will bring gusty winds and showers to portions of Montana.
