NIMO Team (Whitney) is assigned as a planning and operational group in support of the National Multi-Agency Coordinating Group at Boise, ID.

Australia and New Zealand are providing 44 fire specialists and managers to assist with fire suppression operations in California. All personnel will be released after completing their final shifts on the fire line today.

Area Command Team (Lohrey) is managing fire complexes on the Shasta-Trinity and Mendocino National Forests. Area Command Team (Zimmerman) is managing fire complexes on the Six Rivers and Klamath National Forests. NIMO Team (Custer) is assigned to the Shasta-Trinity National Forest.

Iron and Alps Complexes (3 fires), Shasta-Trinity NF. IMT 1 (Molumby). One mile north of Junction City, CA. Heavy timber, brush and grass. Active flanking and backing with uphill runs, torching and short-range spotting. Numerous residences, structures and powerlines threatened.

Siskiyou/Blue 2 Complex (2 fires), Klamath NF. IMT 1 (Wilcock). IMT is also managing the Ukonom Complex. Eighteen miles southwest of Happy Camp, CA. Conifer and hardwood overstory with heavy timber litter. Backing and flanking fire with torching. Cultural sites threatened.

Yolla Bolly Complex (3 fires), Mendocino NF. IMT 2 (Blume). Forty-seven miles southwest of Redding, CA. Timber. Active surface fire with occasional torching and short-range spotting.

Panther, Klamath NF. IMT 2 (Harvey). Fourteen miles southwest of Happy Camp, CA. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with isolated torching. Recreational areas closed.

Ukonom Complex, Six Rivers NF. Ten miles east of Orleans, CA. Timber. Backing fire with isolated torching, creeping and smoldering. Structures and cultural sites threatened.

Bear Wallow Complex (2 fires), Klamath NF. FUMT (Beckman). Confine/contain management strategy. Thirteen miles southeast of Happy Camp, CA. Timber and brush. Active backing and flanking fire with isolated torching.

Canyon Complex, Plumas NF. Minnesota IMT 2 (Mannelin). Sixteen miles northeast of Paradise, CA. Timber. Minimal fire behavior.

Gnarl, Mt. Hood NF. IMT 2 (West). Twenty-four miles south of Hood River, OR. Timber and litter. No further information received.

Dry Creek, Deschutes NF. Confine/contain management strategy. Thirteen miles west of Sisters, OR. Sub-alpine timber and grass. Minimal fire behavior. Last report unless significant activity occurs.
