The Crippled Chinook, National Forests in Mississippi. Previously reported incident. Six miles southwest of Augusta, MS. Timber and southern rough. Minimal fire activity. Structures threatened.

Wrangler, Kisatchie NF. Twenty miles southwest of Natchitoches, LA. Southern rough, pine and hardwood. Minimal fire activity.

Bombing Range Nine 21, National Forests in Florida. Eleven miles west of Astor, FL. Timber and brush. No new information.

* **Harrison Fork**, Kentucky DOF. Started on private land two miles west of Vanceburg, KY. Hardwood litter. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday. No further information received.

Lucky Hollow, George Washington and Jefferson NF. Fourteen miles northeast of Harrisonburg, VA. Timber. Moderate fire activity.

* **Gore Store Road**, Texas Forest Service. Twenty miles southeast of Woodville, TX. Timber. Residences threatened. No further information received.

* **Fish Trap**, Daniel Boone NF. Nine miles northwest of Campton, KY. Hardwood litter. Minimal fire activity. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.
