Predictive Services Discussion: Afternoon relative humidity will drop into the 10-15% range again in New Mexico and west Texas, but winds will remain below critical levels. A strong storm will continue to move slowly across the eastern US bringing thunderstorms to the southeastern and mid-Atlantic states and snow to New England. Another storm system will enter the Pacific Northwest, bringing rain to the Washington and Oregon coasts, and snow to the Northern Rockies and northern Great Basin.
