Doce, Prescott NF. IMT 1 (Sciacca). Seven miles northwest of Prescott, AZ. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with torching and spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations and area closures in effect.

Silver, Gila NF. IMT 2 (Reidy). One mile west of Kingston, NM. Timber. Active crown fire behavior with short-range spotting. Structures threatened. Evacuations and area closures in effect.

Thompson Ridge, Bernalillo District, New Mexico State Forestry. Ten miles north of Jemez Springs, NM. Timber. Minimal fire behavior.

Whites Peak, Cimarron District, New Mexico State Forestry. Fourteen miles southwest of Cimarron, NM. Timber and grass. Creeping and smoldering.

* **Lime Gulch**, Pike and San Isabel NF. IMT 2 (Dallas). Four miles north of Buffalo Creek, CO. Timber. Wind driven fire with short-range spotting. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations and area closures in effect.

* **Wild Rose**, White River Field Office, BLM. IMT 2 (Del Grosso). Twenty-one miles south of Rangely, CO. Timber and grass. Extreme fire behavior with long-range spotting. Structures threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

West Fork Complex, (two fires), San Juan NF. NIMO (Houseman). Fifteen miles north of Pagosa Springs, CO. Timber. Extreme fire behavior with group tree torching and long-range spotting. Structures threatened.

Black Forest, El Paso County. Transfer of command from IMT 1 (Harvey) back to the local unit will occur tomorrow. One mile west of Black Forest, CO. Timber and grass. Minimal fire behavior. Evacuations in effect.

Predictive Services Discussion: An upper low will slowly drift across the northern Rockies, bringing isolated showers and thunderstorms to the Northwest and scattered showers and thunderstorms to the northern Rockies and northern Great Basin. Strong southwest wind and low humidity will produce critical fire weather conditions over the Four Corners region. Isolated windy conditions will also develop in southern California. Scattered thunderstorms will move through the upper Midwest and mid-Mississippi Valley. Afternoon thunderstorms will also form along the Gulf Coast. Temperatures will remain cool over the Northwest, northern Great Basin and New England. The rest of the nation will be very warm. Alaska will see one more day of hot weather with isolated thunderstorms increasing.

ASH PIT HAZARDS

Miscellaneous Category

Ash pits are an inherent and hidden risk to wildland firefighters that can cause severe burns and injuries. Ash pits are created when a ground fire consumes underground fuels creating an empty space that is imperceptible from the surface.

- Environmental factors that increase the risk of ash pit formation after a wildfire:
 - Extensive root systems of trees and shrubs.
 - Deep duff or peat, the organic layer covering mineral soil.
 - Landscapes that have once been cultivated or manipulated by heavy equipment, old dozer piles, sawmills, timber sale yards or decking areas.
 - Small rodent holes that have become filled with decadent combustible debris, beaver holes near dams and stream beds, badger and coyote dens.
 - White ash is sometimes an indicator of ash pits as are swarms of hovering insects.
 - With the sun behind the suspected ash pit, look for small nearly translucent smokes that dissipate quickly above the ground.
 - Ash pits often give off the smell of incomplete combustion or of creosote burning.

- Mitigation measures to consider:
 - Identification of high risk landscape.
 - Identify and flag all hazardous discovered ash pits.
