\* **McKenna**, Gila National Forest. Twenty miles northeast of Gila, NM. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing and creeping. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

**Predictive Services Discussion:** Scattered showers and thunderstorms will move through the eastern half of the nation through the weekend while warm and mainly dry conditions continue in the West. By Sunday, an upper low will slowly cross into the Interior West, bringing cooler temperatures over the northern two-thirds of the region and scattered rain, thunderstorms and mountain snows. The trough will spread to the eastern U.S. by the end of the week with rain and scattered thunderstorms. Temperatures will be cooler across the northern two-thirds of the nation for the week with very warm weather across the southern States.
