Predictive Services Discussion: A cold front will slowly drift across the Great Lakes and the Mississippi Valley while another front moves through the Pacific Northwest and the northern Rockies. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will develop across the Gulf States and along the Appalachians to New England. Scattered rain and possible snow will move into the Northwest and far northern Rockies. Cool conditions will continue across the Northwest, the Rockies, the Midwest and New England. Temperatures will continue warm across the South and very warm over the desert Southwest and California.
